**Andy Dapron** - started the meeting with an opening prayer, including the victims of Charleston S.C.

All approved previous meeting minutes.

**Fr. Schilli** was introduced, has been ordained 38 years, was a high school teacher for 25 years, last parish was Sacred Heart in Eureka MO.

**Fr. T** - discussed the new piano project, new baby grand piano being installed, have moved out 1 pew to make room.

Five members of MMOC met regarding the Parish Viability study that has 123 questions. Strengths and weaknesses were the focus of the questions. A report is due in November 2015. At our August meeting we will discuss the plan that will be submitted.

**Ed Lewandowski** - surveyed 150 families about PSR, there were 40 forms returned. Ideas were discussed about how to enhance parent involvement with PSR students.

**Dave Bujnak** – stated that at our August meeting, he will bring the finished Parish Viability report for all to review before the November 1 deadline

Commission updates:

**Jill Farmer** – discussed the plans for the parish picnic. Wendy Franklin has the picnic under control. This year 60+ cars were registered, last year there were 48 cars. BBQ needs help setting up and tearing down.

**John Schumacker** – Evangelization – discussed that the apartment complex on hwy 21 is being expanded and is doubling in size and is an opportunity to add parishioners. Committee reaches out by placing door hangers on new homes and apartments. Evangelization – has 3 new ambassadors and are going to add campus tours to new parishioners to their responsibilities. Process for new parishioners is for the clergy to interview then Ann follows up with sending out an information mailing to the new parishioners.

**Mary Factor** – Christian Service – announced that Joyce Kenworthy(sp?) has been added as a board member at Feed My People.– St. Vincent DePaul – their financial reports are submitted to Randy Howell and are not part of the parish finances.

**Kathy Newbold** - Health- has added 2 new helpers - July 17 is line dancing Health – Last week was the garden tour and was received very well with \$352 made from the event. \$112 profit from the raffle and wreaths.

**Mort Small** - Finance – 2 weeks left in fiscal year. Currently we are 2% above last year's total dollars collected from weekly collections. "Dollar More" initiative has contributed to the increase in collections. The piano fundraiser has raised over \$24,000. Some of the new LED (light emitting diode) (high efficiency) lights have been installed with no issues from the change of bulbs. Utility savings will be seen with the switch to LED light bulbs.

**Daniell Farmer** – Youth – serviced day is June 28<sup>th</sup>. Thirty five are registered for Stubenville, including Father T. Pancake breakfast was a success.

**Dave Bujnak** – distributed updated office procedure information to all the new members. All are to follow the procedures for check requests. For the newsletter, provide a 175 word or less information about your commission, Submit a hard copy, and email copy and a file on a thumb drive.

**Dave Bujnak** - submitted a recommendation of stopping the practice of bringing snacks to PC meeting. Motion was approved by voice vote.
