Dear Parishioners of Mary Mother of the Church,

Before others share the news with you, as pastor, I want to tell you that over the past few months the Parish Council has been considering changing the time and number of our weekend Masses. No, it is not a matter of fewer numbers on our membership list; we gain new members almost every month.

In June, I will again be the only priest assigned to our parish. I feel I can easily handle one Mass on Saturday and two on Sunday. (When I am away, the priests who enjoy coming to our parish will be present.) From a liturgical point of view, we need to remember the Saturday/Sunday obligation is not simply a personal one, but a communal one. On these days our community is obliged to come together. Having more members at the Masses may better provide that sense of truly coming together as the Body of Christ. Available volunteers for our ministries would not be stretched so thin; and time between Masses will allow the choirs time to prepare. Our Ad/Fin Commission members believe this will lessen our expenses as well.

Later on, we will be sending all parishioners two suggested ways of arranging the time of Masses. Your responses will guide the Council as to which plan will be put into practice. Our goal is to begin the new schedule on June 1st.

LITURGY NOTES

We have had a **quieter start to our Lenten Season** this year while observing our seasonal focus: **“Be still and know that I am God,”** and by **singing the song “Be Still”** for the first three Sundays of Lent. However, when the Fourth Sunday of Lent arrives, things change for a brief time. This Sunday is called **Laetare Sunday** (pronounced Lay-tah-ray). It also has other names such as *Rose Sunday, Refreshment Sunday, or Mid-Lent Sunday*. **What is the reason for the change on this Sunday and why is it different from other Sundays of Lent?**

Officially, **the midpoint of Lent is the Thursday before Laetare Sunday**, so it has become tradition, as mentioned in the Catholic Encyclopedia, for **the middle of Lent to be celebrated with “one day of special signs of joy intended to encourage the faithful in their course through the season of penance . . . the contrast between Laetare and other Sundays is thus emphasized and is a sign of the joys of this life. . . [and we express] restraint mingled with a certain somberness.”** The day is marked by the use of the color rose mixed in with purple; there is brighter lighting, the appearance of some flowering plants, and the use of more lively, joyful music. **“The day is a day of relaxation from the normal Lenten rigors, a day of hope with Easter being at last within sight.”**

Does it feel like the days of spring are already on the way? Many are looking forward to outdoor sports, projects and other activities. While returning to these, use care to avoid muscle strains and joint sprains. Conditioning to strengthen muscles and warming up properly to loosen muscles is necessary at all ages. Avoid slippery and uneven surfaces; and make sure to have well-fitting, proper footwear. Avoid activity to the point of fatigue as muscles that are too tired are less likely to provide good support for joints. However, if a strain or sprain does occur, remember that immediate treatment should always include rest, ice, compression and elevation. If the injury is mild, it can be successfully treated at home. How to know when to seek medical attention? Three guidelines are given: Inability to walk more than four steps without significant pain. Inability to move the affected joint. Having numbness in any part of the injured area. Source: www.mayoclinic.org, keyword: strains and sprains. Enjoy the coming season; and I pray for a blessed and peaceful Lent for all.

CITIZENS AGAINST PORNOGRAPHY

Pornography and prostitution are “symbiotically related” to human trafficking and the latter cannot exist without the former (Fall 2012, *Journal of Human Rights and Civil Society*). Trafficking victims often are forced to produce pornography, especially hard core pornography, and the consumption of pornography contributes to human trafficking. If we are to end the trade in human beings, we must fight sex trafficking on all fronts, including identifying and advocating for changes in public policy and law.

Two bills in Congress, HR 3226 and S 1968, would amend the Securities Exchange Act to require companies to disclose in their annual report steps taken to address human trafficking. Please contact your elected officials and ask that they support this and other steps taken to end human trafficking. Senator Blunt’s local number is 314-725-4484, Senator McCaskill’s is 314-367-1364 and Congresswoman Wagner’s is 636-779-5449. The St. Louis area is vulnerable to the influx of traffickers because of the number of interstate highways.

A friend recently shared that he takes for granted his child will go from school-to-college-to-career. He assumes success. Others do not share this vision. Another friend told me of her 17-year-old son who took his own life while being held in solitary confinement in an adult prison. A successful young man recently told of how a trip to the principal’s office took him down a path that nearly led to prison. All were stories told while discussing the “school-to-prison pipeline.”

MCU’s 2016 General Assembly/Dinner was held on January 26 at Central Reform Congregation in St. Louis City. Accomplishments of 2015 were celebrated and goals for 2016 were set.

In 2016, MCU will target the “school-to-prison pipeline” in a campaign labeled, “Break the Pipeline.” The Education Task Force is targeting reduction of out-of-school suspensions while school districts are exploring changes in disciplinary policies. The Juvenile Justice Task Force is supporting state legislation aimed at keeping juveniles in juvenile detention centers where they can receive education and counseling.


