In March, 2015, Archbishop Carlson determined that, for the sake of my long-term health, I would benefit from a year as a senior associate in a parish. This would relieve me of the typical stress of parish administration most pastors experience. It was decided that, after one year, I would once again be re-assigned as a pastor. That year will expire in June when annual transfers take place. To date I have only had one brief conversation with the priest personnel director which indicated to me that last year's plan for me would go forward as planned. So, as many of you know, I anticipate being appointed as a pastor once again somewhere in the Archdiocese. As of today, I have no idea where that will be. I expect to receive notification from the Archbishop some time in mid-May and would move in mid-June. I have been greatly blessed by my year here at Mary Mother. The diminishing numbers of available priests continues to challenge the Archbishop to provide the best distribution of priests and deacons in every parish. I encourage you to continue to pray for an increase of vocations to Holy Orders in our Archdiocese. As soon as I am able to inform you of my new assignment, I will do so. I expect that will be in late May. God bless you all.

The "majority results of the survey would be strongly reviewed with discernment by the council; and the new Mass schedule will be decided by consensus of the Parish Council." The implementation of the new schedule is planned to start on June 5, 2016.




## LITURGY NOTES

The Easter Season is coming to a close early this year. **We will be celebrating the Solemnity of Pentecost on May 15.** Here are some thoughts about **the origin of Pentecost** from the *Sourcebook for Sundays and Seasons* published by LTP Publications: **Pentecost is a Greek word which means “fiftieth,”** and “in early Christianity it referred to the entire fifty days of Easter. The **roots of Pentecost** can be found in the **Jewish Festival of Weeks - a fifty-day celebration following Passover.** It was a harvest festival in which the first fruits of the harvest were offered to God in gratitude. **Early Christians reinterpreted the Jewish festival as a commemoration of the coming of the Holy Spirit** because the Book of Acts records the **Holy Spirit coming to the disciples when the festival of Pentecost was taking place.”**

The *Sourcebook* also encourages us to “**pull out all of the stops this weekend since it is the culmination of the great fifty days of Easter.**” This year, we will have a large group of our Music Ministers present for **a celebration of Pentecost at the 9:30 Mass on Sunday, May 15.** All parishioners are invited to attend, and **feel free to wear red** to represent the “fire” of the Holy Spirit. For that matter, **one could also wear the other colors of fire: orange and yellow.** Hope to see you filled with the Holy Spirit!

Happy Spring! These days, as we are busily preparing for the summer months, keep in mind that the intensity of ultraviolet radiation is highest during this time of year (late spring/early summer) in “our part of the world” [www.cdc.gov/cancer/skin](http://www.cdc.gov/cancer/skin). Naturally, protection from those “UV rays” remains important all year long. Replenish your supply of sunscreen (SPF 30 or greater); and plan ahead by applying it 30 minutes before going out into the sunshine. Resume the habit of reapplying sunscreen every 2 hours (more often if doing activities that make us wet/sweaty). Wide brim hats and loose-fitting, long sleeve shirts are highly recommended. Adults: Note that alcoholic beverages dilate the blood vessels, putting blood cells closer to the surface, which makes it easier to absorb the sun’s rays. All ages: Drink plenty of water and other healthy beverages to keep well-hydrated!

## ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE COMMISSION

One the hardest things to budget each year at Mary Mother is the ever-increasing cost of our utilities. For all the families in our parish, this is obvious – we all experience increases. Looking back, our utility costs have increased from \$41,488 in 2012 to \$59,507 in 2015. I am projecting that our 2016 cost will be approximately \$62,000. For the 2016/2017, we are budgeting \$64,540. What's driving this increase? For the most part, it is the increase in sewer costs. Our electric utility rates have gone up as well; but we have taken measures to offset the increased costs, i.e. solar panels, LED lighting, etc. We are currently installing digital temperature controls throughout the parish with Wi-Fi communications to schedule our heating/ventilation/air conditioning usage based on Mass times and seasonal needs. We will continue to implement LED lighting this summer in our Parish Activity Center and parking lots. We are always interested in creating additional savings for our parish family -- YOUR ideas and involvement are welcome.

Here's an interesting comment I came across: Financial giving is not God's way of raising money – it's his way of raising children.

Thank you so much for the many baby items and cash (over \$600) donated to Birthright of Hillsboro which took place on the weekend of April 9-10<sup>th</sup>. This group will be moving to a larger facility later this year so these contributions are very much needed.

As of April 12<sup>th</sup> there were 631 babies saved in this spring's worldwide 40 Days for Life campaign. Many more are saved in the campaign; but it takes time to have them confirmed. Four more abortion facilities closed during this campaign, bringing the total to 70 since 2007. Six more abortion clinic workers had a change of heart, bringing the total to 133.

In our own city's campaign, spearheaded by Coalition for Life, there were 35 babies saved from abortion. There were 881 people who participated in the St. Louis campaign by witnessing in front of Planned Parenthood and 1,000 hours of promised prayer. Thank you to all those who volunteered for our designated Adopt-a-Day on February 20<sup>th</sup>.

In the first quarter of 2016 the MMOC Vincentians logged 682 hours of service and drove 1124 miles making 23 home visits to our neighbors in need. The volunteer hours also reflect time spent working at the Thrift Store to earn voucher credit, serving 148 people on our regularly scheduled days operating the St. Vincent de Paul lunch window, collecting and recycling scrap metal, and moving furniture. Because of your contributions, we have been able to assist parishioners with the following expenses:

Utilities	\$2550
Rent	\$2108
Bedding	\$ 300
Transportation	\$ 581
Food Gift Cards	\$ 428 (to cover perishable items)
Food	\$1794 in food delivered (at \$1.25 per item)

We are occasionally called upon to contribute funds to other SVDP conferences in our district when they are faced with serious emergency needs beyond their resources. This is called "twinning" and is similar to the "seed money" other conferences gave us when we started up here at Mary Mother. Twinning can be requested for food, shelter, and emergency medical needs. This quarter we contributed \$1820 in twinning funds to several of our neighboring parishes. In return we have sent some of our clients to other parishes for perishable food items, housing, and transportation needs.

We were able to provide this assistance due to your generosity in on-going food donations, the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday collection, and the scrap metal drive. Thank you for your

Do you know. . .

- Nearly 8000 preschoolers in the U.S. were suspended during the 2011-12 school year.
- In St. Louis thousands of suspensions are issued to elementary school children each year, resulting in a loss of tens of thousands of hours of instruction.
- Missouri ranks #1 in the U.S. for the most out-of-school suspensions.
- The gap between suspensions rates of black and white students in Missouri public schools is the widest in the nation.
- Children as young as 12 years can be tried in adult courts.
- Youth convicted of a crime are less likely to offend again if they have received services in a juvenile facility, rather than serve a sentence in an adult prison. If a child is charged and certified as an adult, he/she can be placed in an adult jail and subject to isolation, even before being convicted of a crime.

**CITIZENS AGAINST PORNOGRAPHY**

Citizens Against Pornography is an interfaith community organization begun in 1989 to alert and educate the public about the problem and danger of pornography. The organization is a committee under the Christian Formation Commission but has members from other churches and pro-family entities. CAP serves the community by bringing together under one umbrella numerous churches and pro-family organizations to keep the public informed about the insidious nature of pornography.

One educational tool used by CAP is the public forum. It has provided forums on internet safety, the insidious danger of "sexting," teenage sexuality and the danger of STDs, human trafficking, and pornography and music. Often it is one of the forerunners to discuss a topic. One such topic was teen sexting which, according to an article in the April, 2016 edition of the *aft Journal*, is epidemic. Sexting is the sending of sexually-explicit messages or pictures by email or text. Not only is it morally repulsive, it could be a felony. De we want to send teens to jail?
