

The initial disbursement for Block 3 parishes has been received from Beyond Sunday. This initial payment of \$45,367.05 to Mary Mother was received as scheduled on March 15, 2017. This amount is the 40% (that is to be returned to parishes) of what had been collected by Beyond Sunday for Mary Mother pledges paid through December 31, 2016. The next disbursement that is projected to be \$12,437.78 will be October 15, 2017; and then on this March 15 and October 15 semi-annual schedule for the remainder of the (5) five years of the pledge period. These funds are being monitored closely and are held in a separate Mary Mother account to be used only as determined by the Parish Council and not for general purposes.

The FY2017/2018 budget including Major Projects identified to enhance our parish facilities has been compiled and approved by AdFin and presented for review to the Parish Council at the April, 2017 meeting to be approved at the May, 2017 Parish Council meeting.

The AdFin Commission monthly meeting is on the 3rd Tuesday of the month in the church meeting room at 6:00PM. This time change is to make AdFin more accessible to parishioners who may work and may not generally be available at other times.

The Contemplative Core Team has reviewed the brainstorming ideas from the April 23rd meeting of interested parishioners and summarized them into 5 areas of focus for the contemplative prayer efforts at Mary Mother. They are: Hold regular gatherings. Help integrate CP into regular prayer life. Expand understanding of CP and include time for prayer. Teach and deepen understanding and practice of Lectio Divina. Start a contemplative prayer group. Hold orientations. Foster and conduct various focused retreat opportunities. Foster multi-parish/denominational participation.

"I felt attacked." "I felt blamed."

What we witnessed at "Mother 2 Mother" was not the program they prepared, but Black pain on display. This is what discrimination does to people. It makes you angry, resentful, fearful. I get angry when I'm unjustly accused one time. They lashed out against the White audience. In their pain they did blame us, collectively.

Their pain just doesn't touch us.

Let's take a look. We were attacked because we are White – we represent the White Power that set up the institutions, laws, and policies. Sure, there are civil rights laws; but the practice of the law is different if your skin is Black. Discrimination touches their income, neighborhoods, transportation, schools, and their health. Funding goes to white neighborhoods, white causes, white choices because predominantly White people are making the decisions.

Bishop Braxton felt discrimination and finally spoke out. He implores us to pay attention. We didn't buy a slave or create redlining; but our silence in the market place is killing our Black community. We are responsible to build "Thy kingdom come, on earth."

Speak out on injustice. Talk to a Black person. Ninety-nine percent are wonderful people to know.

TITHING

March, 2017 - 4 Sundays - \$1,003 each agency

Feed My People – (\$1,000 grocery gift cards) Provides emergency food and many other social services to the poor in South County.

Whole Kids Outreach – Provides health and wellness services in five poverty stricken rural counties in southern Missouri, with a goal of preventing child abuse.

Women's Place – Provides non-residential, drop-in care for survivors of domestic and/or sexual abuse in the St. Louis region. Their mission is to promote the safety and well-being of women through systemic change.

St. Pius V Immigrant and Refugee Program – Direct outreach to immigrants and refugees around St. Pius V parish. Direct services provided to the poor include medicine, rent, and clothing on an emergency basis.

English Tutoring Project – Supports the teaching of English to children from immigrant and refugee families at four Catholic elementary schools in the metro area.

People to People – Direct aid, including medical, food and water, to the people in Haiti, 80% of whom live in direct poverty.

April, 2017 - 5 Sundays - \$1,212 each agency

St. Augustine Wellston Center – Helps support the members of the former five parish communities that merged to become St. Augustine Parish. Services include a food pantry, thrift store, employment counseling, health services and a GED program.

Mary Ryder Home – serves St. Louis' most vulnerable senior women, nourishing their social, physical and emotional needs, and enhancing their quality of life through compassionate care.

St. Peter and Paul Meals Program – Feeds poor and homeless in the community. Donations are used for food and supplies.

Missouri Catholic Conference – Catholic Church's advocacy group in Jefferson City promotes the inclusion of Catholic teaching in state legislation. Speaking together they influence public policy to represent issues important to the beliefs of our faith.

Holy Trinity Parish – Assists an inner city parish in the Hyde Park area in its efforts to revitalize the neighborhood.

Lemay Child and Family Center – Provides early care and education to children in a diverse, nurturing environment, and strengthening families by promoting children's healthy physical, cognitive, and social-emotional development.

PORNOGRAPHY**

State legislatures are recognizing pornography as a dangerous epidemic with many personal and societal consequences. To date four states (Utah, Tennessee, South Dakota, Virginia) have passed a resolution declaring pornography to be a public health crisis.

Parents Television Council estimates that during this year, a quarter of a billion people are expected to access adult content from mobile devices (May 2017 edition, *afaJournal*). Pornography demeans women, desensitizes men and destroys marriages.

There is much to be done. Join with Citizens Against Pornography on the third Thursday at 7:30 p.m. CAP serves the community by bringing together under one umbrella numerous churches and pro-family organizations to educate and inform the public about the insidious nature of pornography and to encourage members of the public to be vigilant about this public health crisis.

The first quarter of 2017 was exceptionally busy and productive. MMOC Vincentians contributed 789 hours of service and drove 1920 miles picking up scrap metal and making 32 home visits to families in the parish boundaries. We staffed Hardee’s Heat Up St. Louis and prepared and served 294 dinners and another 283 lunches at St. Vincent DePaul Church. We also delivered disaster funds and food to Perryville after the tornado. Because of your generosity we have been able to assist our neighbors with the following expense:

Housing	\$3534
Bedding	\$90
Transportation	\$111
Medical	\$720
Food Gift Cards	\$325 (to cover perishable items)
Food	\$60 (in food delivered at \$1.25 per item)

We were blessed to receive a \$500 Good Neighbor Grant from State Farm because one of our Associate members retired from there and has volunteered over 40 hours with the scrap metal team.

Despite a last minute attempt by the House to add Raise the Age to SB 50, the bill never made it across the finish line. SB 50 was a health care directive bill, to which numerous amendments were added (including Raise the Age) once it reached the House.

Raise the Age is an effort to increase juvenile jurisdiction from 17 to 18 years old. Missouri is only one of seven states that still treat 17-year-olds as adults under the law. The vast majority of 17-year-olds are arrested for non-violent crimes; those juveniles who commit serious crimes would still be treated as adults.

The Missouri Catholic Conference supported Raise the Age as it coincides with the USCCB position that young people should not be placed in adult jails and treated as adults. This issue is expected to resurface next year.

Every month at the Juvenile Detention Centers in the city and county, they hold a birthday party for the teens who are incarcerated. Friday, May 12, MCU sponsored the one in the county. Gifts are brought for the kids, their only party.
