From the Pastor's Computer....

Do you ever find yourself moving so quickly from one event to another that the only thing you can say to others is "Hi and bye," all in one sentence? That's what my first few months here at the parish are feeling like. Right now, we are in the "Hi" part. On September 12, I will say "bye" for 9 weeks.

For those who haven't heard, I have received permission from the Archbishop to take a sabbatical in the fall of 2017. The word "sabbath," from which the word "sabbatical" is derived, means "to rest from labor." After 20 years as a pastor, I've been given the opportunity to "rest" from the daily activities of being a pastor and to take some time to pray, reflect, read and study.

My sabbatical will be from September 12, 2017 through November 21, 2017. It has two components. During the first three weeks, I will be making a pilgrimage to Assisi. We begin in Rome and spend two weeks in Assisi visiting those sites that are special to the Franciscan Community. Upon returning from Assisi, I will travel to a Benedictine abbey and school of theology in Collegeville, MN, - St. John's - for six weeks of study. I will be returning to the parish on the Tuesday before Thanksgiving.

Would you like to make some cards with me?



St. Agatha Center – Ministers to the poor within parish boundaries, includes food pantry and education center.

Sisters of Divine Providence (LaPosada)– Provides housing and shelter for indigent immigrants in San Benito, Texas.

Health Resource Center – Provides free healthcare access for North St. Louis community using supervised medical students from St. Louis University. Includes clinics for pediatrics, well women, healthy living, diabetes, cardiology, asthma, allergies and foot care.

St. Louis University Prison Program – An educational college prison program aimed at breaking the cycle of poverty and recidivism. SLU offers an Associate's Degree program to the incarcerated, as well as prison staff, with a demonstrated reduction in repeat offenses from 65% to 15% for those who complete the program.

St. Stephen Catholic Church – Provides assistance for rural parish in Richwood, MO. Parish serves a very poor area of the state and their need is great.

Blood of Christ Parish, Bolivia – Provides missionary presence in the rural area of La Paz. Sangre de Cristo is one of the many priestless missions in Bolivia.

June, 2017 - 4 Sundays - \$940 each agency

Carondelet Betterment Foundation Food Pantry – Supports the city neighborhood through multiple social programs and through their food pantry, serving hundreds of families each month.

St. Augustine Christmas Program – Provides Christmas baskets and gift certificates for shoes for inner-city poor families.

Sisters of Divine Providence (Room at the Inn) – Assists their Room and the Inn shelter for homeless women and children in St. Louis.

Center for Women in Transition – Assists women as they transition from the criminal justice system back to their families and community.

The Family Center – Provides annual counseling, spiritual direction, educational programs, group facilitation and outreach for those otherwise unable to afford the Center's services. The Mary Margaret Program reaches out to low-income families, especially single mothers with children.

Redemptorists in Thailand – Assists children who have been orphaned or abandoned by parents with AIDS. Mothers and children who have the disease are also under care.

Exactly what is MCU? How long have we been in it and why? Is it a charity, a 501(3) c organization? Maybe you have had some of these questions twirling in your head, or you didn't even know it existed. Metropolitan Congregations United is exactly what its name says. We consist of various congregations, which are broadening our base. We now have two Community Organizers working in the St. Charles/St. Peter's area.

We are NOT a charity; we work on systemic change. Coming to us hungry or wanting an a/c is NOT going to happen. There are plenty of organizations that take care of the immediate needs of people. We are not one. We are in it for the long term work of changing the system. Most of the time, those who put in so much effort and time do not live to see the results of their work. But we don't quit; because, if the problems of our society are going to be helped or destroyed, it takes workers in the field to eventually see the crops.



SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul believes that helping neighbors starts at home. Every conference has resources to offer their communities; but some have more funding than others. In keeping with the vision of Blessed Frédéric Ozanam to create a "network of charity," the Society's twinning program matches conferences with unmet needs with other conferences that can offer greater financial and spiritual support. In 1979 Twinning was declared an official fundamental activity of the Society, as the Council General in Paris requested that all nations establish Twinning Committees at all Council levels.

Mary Mother falls in the Gravois District along with 14 other parish conferences. When one of these conferences encounters a crisis need that surpasses their financial capability, a twinning request is forwarded to the rest of us. This happens several times a year; and we respond with a contribution to that conference.

In addition, we regularly twin with four extremely poor conferences at St. Francis deSales, St. Andrew, St. Anthony, and St. Stephen parishes. All of the funds shared by twinning have come from scrap metal collections.
