

For the **Sundays of October**, we put our attention on Respecting Life in all of its forms. **Our focus is "Celebrate Life."** **October 1 is Respect Life Sunday.** We acknowledge the **importance of life from conception to advanced age.** At each Mass, we include a ceremony during the gathering rite to show our respect for human life and to demonstrate **our relationship to the ministry of Birthright.** **Scriptures remind us to "do nothing out of selfishness or out of vain glory, rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves"** Let us remember to respect and guard all of creation especially those who cannot speak for themselves: the unborn children.

On the Second Sunday of the month, **October 8**, we offer the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** for those who are ill or infirmed. With this sacrament, we **reach out to those who need to be touched by God's healing hands.**

The fourth Sunday of the month is **World Mission Sunday, October 22.** On this day we support the persistent efforts of those who have been called to **go forth into the corners of the earth** to preach Good News and bring God's love to all peoples.

- 1.) St. Augustine Wellston Center – Helps support the members of the former 5 parish communities that merged to become St. Augustine Parish. Services include a food pantry, thrift store, employment counseling, health services and a GED program.
- 2.) Energy Care – Provides financial assistance for utility bills for those facing loss of gas/electric service.
- 3.) Let's Start – Assists women who are discharged from prison to face the challenge of integrating back into society, with support for housing, education, counseling, and job searches.
- 4.) Birthright of Hillsboro – Provides love, support and hope to women facing unplanned pregnancies, including information, referrals and resources to assist them.
- 5.) Vincent Gray Alternative High School – Helps provide an education for poor, at-risk young men and women in a supportive and respectful atmosphere.
- 6.) Microfinancing Partners in Africa – A micro-financing ministry of the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood and the Sisters of St. Joseph that provides help for women establishing cottage industries to support their families.

The August meeting for this commission, held on August 20, was a presentation and discussion by Dr. John Wright on African-American issues. It was held in the parish hall from 12:30 to 2:00. Dr. Wright is a St. Louis educator, author, historian, and speaker. He is an alumnus of Sumner High School.

Ginny Schrapen opened the meeting by reading a poem, "My Visit to the Mountain Top," by Will Bolden. After Ginny introduced Bill Peters, the chairman of the Christian Service Commission, he introduced Dr. Wright.

Dr. Wright talked about many subjects that the Black communities had to suffer for their race. He told of other countries like South Africa that sets different policies for native black African families. He also mentioned that in St. Louis, there is discrimination for jobs because of race and a lack of ability to purchase housing. Most were not included in the GI Bill because of race. He also talked about how they were segregated in schools and not allowed the education that others received. The meeting ended with Bill Peters reading Psalm 85:11-14. There were at least 80 people attending, many from other parishes.

MCU Annual Public Meeting

It has been a year since we inaugurated our theme based on the DOJ report from the Ferguson Draft: **Break the School to Prison Pipeline**. We have met with most school superintendents in our Metro Area. That in itself was quite a big undertaking. We also were able to take "our Show on the Road" and give presentations to those congregations that wanted to know more in depth what we meant by Breaking the Pipeline.

Our work has just begun; nothing this big changes in a short time. I serve on the Juvenile Justice Team; and we deal with eliminating the Out of School suspension for Pre-K to third grade. That has been welcomed in several districts. We also are working with our state legislators to get the age of juveniles at 17 to be deemed an adult at 18 and kept in Juvenile Detention so they can be with others and be educated. We are hoping that this comes to fruition this year. Missouri is just one of about eight states that have this young age limit. It costs so much more to put a juvenile in adult prison than in Juvenile Detention

This meeting will be on Thursday, November 9, 6:30-8:00 PM. The location (when found) will be listed in our bulletin. We had to make a commitment to sign up 20-25 people.
